Lighting Technician – Day Maintenance

Reporting to the Head of Lighting, & Assistant Head of Lighting, the Lighting Technician – Day Maintenance is responsible for working as part of the Lighting, Video & SFX team to operate, maintain, and install Lighting, Video, SFX and Laser show elements and systems in a safe and consistent manner for "La Perle". Additionally, the employee will participate in the development, operations, and maintenance procedures for Lighting and Laser equipment and elements that pertain to the Lighting, Video & SFX and/or Technical department

Roles and responsibilities

Specific Job Functions –

- Run show tracks and daily rehearsals as required.
- Run thorough daily rig checks, ensuring the correct functionality of the entire Lighting and Laser systems.
- Facilitate and complete fixture repairs and replacements working as part of the maintenance team. Be ready at all times take the lead in any last minute replacements due to any unexpected failures.
- Learn and cover other show tracks including SFX, Video, Follow spot and opportunities in other departments as required.
- Inspect and maintain the Lighting, and Laser server networks and all associated equipment/systems.
- Be prepared for a flexible schedule for work calls, special events, rehearsals, training, maintenance and evening show performances.
- Participate in all external projects, including assisting with special events and performances.
- Ensure the shows lighting integrity and artistic intent is kept to high a standard. Reference and update relevant show documentation.
- Assist the aquatics team with the repairs of underwater lighting fixtures.
- Inspect, monitor and maintain the lighting inventory, equipment and systems. Update maintenance and inspection records as directed.

Responsible for working as a part of the lighting team to install, maintain, and operate theatre power, network systems, Grand MA2 consoles in a safe and consistent manner for the "Laperle" show.
Maintain a safe working environment by conforming to all established safety policies and

procedures. Participate in all required safety classes and emergency rescue procedure trainings.

• Develop a thorough knowledge of all departmental equipment specific to the production in order to operate it safely.
